SOME OF THE CHEMICALS ARE:

Arsenic: Known carcinogen, can cause damage to the nervous system and the blood count. Children are at a higher risk.
Benzene: Long term exposure decreases red blood cells, causes leukemia, and birth defects

Benzo(a)pyren: Known carcinogen; sunlight intensifies harmful effects of exposure

Lead: Causes brain and nerve damage, behavior and learning problems, slowed growth, hearing problems and headaches in children, reproductive problems, high blood pressure, nerve disorders, memory and concentration problems, and muscle and joint pain

Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons (TPH): Different compounds that come from crude oil. Many linked to illnesses, including nerve damage, lung damage, cancer, and fetal disorders

Naphthalene: Known cause of cancer; can cause damage to the liver, kidneys, and eyes.
